Infant Room

Every month we would like to highlight one class and see what they are doing!

This month the infant room is practicing:

Cognitive Development by observing others activities and examining their environment.

Language Development by responding when their name is called and using eye contact and facial expressions.

Social Development by increasing consistency in sleeping, eating, and walking patterns.

Fine Motor Skills by color introduction to the older babies and holding a toy or finger for the younger babies.

Gross Motor Skills by mimicking hand clapping or waving good-bye and practicing cross lateral exercises.

Music and Movement by singing and dancing to favorite songs such as The Wheels on the Bus and Color Song.

Sensory throughout the day, especially during meal time, floor time, music time, and art time.

If you would like to donate to the infant room, they could use:

Do you have a strong willed child? Try this:

- Be Calm Your calmness helps calm a chaotic atmosphere
- Be Clear Clarity helps you reinforce boundaries
- Be Consistent Consistency helps children learn that being in charge is not up for grabs
- Follow Through Children want to know what you mean
- Delegate Some Control Let the child earn an appropriate measure of decision making privileges
- Teach and Reinforce Empathy and Humanity Help them learn to listen and care about others by modeling
